

A POND-ering ISSUE

Keeping our pond in an attractive state of appearance has been on ongoing problem for many years. The most obvious issue being the "pond scum" syndrome which everyone is quick to point out. I appreciate all the advice I have received from concerned individuals on how to fix the problem. Yet ironically, we have been using the exact product for years that is consistently being recommended.

After further researching the issue, I have learned that many factors contribute to the overall health, appearance and life cycle of a pond. Unfortunately there is no "cure all" or single product that addresses all the variety of aquatic weeds. Weeds and other circumstances must be identified to prescribe proper treatment.

Water chemistry also plays an important role in the condition of a pond.

Our pond was primarily created as retention for storm water runoff. A significant amount of surface water flows into the pond with each rain. Fertilizers and other chemicals that have been applied to surrounding lawns and fields are also carried along with the runoff that enters the pond. These fertilizers can actually promote the growth of pond weeds, thereby exacerbating the problem. Also, such chemicals impact the pH of the water and introduce a new dynamic to the issue.

In an effort to regain and enhance the beauty and impact of our pond I have recently reached out to a company that specializes in maintaining small bodies of water such as ours. They have submitted a proposal and laid out a timetable for specific targeted treatment that would begin early next spring. Their opinion is that it would be more cost effective to begin treatment next spring following the typical winter weed growth reduction cycle rather than attempting to address the problem at this time of year.

With that in mind, I am hoping to include pond maintenance by an outside company as part of next year's operating budget. Additionally, we are looking to replace the present non-functional lighted fountain as part of next year's capital enhancements.

We are all very anxious to get our pond back to the esthetically pleasing feature that it was intended to be. It truly adds to the beauty of our campus and I miss it as much as everyone else.



much like the old violin. Then the master comes and the foolish crowd, they never understand. The worth of a soul and the change that is wrought,


