#### **OSF Health Education Program**

#### "Taking Control of Your Parkinson's with LSVT"

Do you know someone with Parkinson's disease? Do they have difficulty walking, speaking and using their arms for normal activities? Parkinson's disease is a neurological disease that affects the part of the brain that produces dopamine. Due to the decrease in dopamine, people with Parkinson's disease may develop soft or low voice, tremors, difficulty moving or walking, loss of smell, and small handwriting.

Approximately 60,000 Americans are diagnosed with Parkinson's disease each year and men are 1.5 times more likely to have Parkinson's disease than women.

The OSF Therapy department has therapists trained in a rehab program for people with Parkinson's disease called BIG and LOUD, which aid people in relearning to move big again and speak louder.



From the time I took your contributions to the collection center in Butler, IL about 4 months ago until now, you have contributed 22 Bibles and lots of other kinds of Christian Literature. Thank you all so much.

The Bibles can be in ANY condition—written in, coffee spills, pages missing—any condition. You cannot even imagine how much they are appreciated. Below is an article I received just a few days ago from one of those back-countries that have no access to Bibles/Christian Literature, except through your contributions! So please continue donating.

Zimbabwe:

We received 10 boxed of literature from your literature distributors Martin and Ivy. We asked them to send this message to Love Packages with our thanks. We received tracts, books, Our Daily Bread, and the Upper Room books. You have no idea hos you have empowered our women, men, youth, and children's ministry. We are extremely grateful, our church is 350 kilometers from Harare and it is very difficult for us to have any literature. To receive brand new paper back Bibles, this was the greatest gift ever!

Since January 2019, the distribution center in Butler has shipped 340 tons of your contributions to Ghana, India, South Africa, Burma, and other countries that have no other access to Bible and Christian Literature. Thanks to everyone for your contribution to such a worthy cause!
