We have discovered cigarettes butts in our lobby trash cans in McKendree. Smoking is not permitted in apartments or on apartment balconies. We appreciate your reminding guests about this policy. **We appreciate everyone's commitment to safety.**

# **Community Covid Corner**



On August 11th, the CDC updated their COVID guidance for the general community. A few key points to take away are:

- The Community Level assigned by the CDC is a good way to know your risk. Each level (Low, Medium, High) comes with guidance on what you can do to stay safer. The Community Level is updated weekly on Fridays; and is included in the COVID updates posted throughout the Village.
- Staying up to date with vaccination remains a key component in COVID protection. If you are interested in vaccination and/or booster, please notify your physician or reception to have your name added to next booster clinic.
- If you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you no longer have to quarantine.
   You should wear a mask when indoors for 10 days and be tested on day 5 or sooner if you develop symptoms.
- If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 infection you should;
  - Contact your physician—there are new medications to help treat COVID-19 illness
  - Isolate based on current guidelines (isolation time frames vary with severity of disease)

Why Socialization is important for Seniors.

Seniors are more likely to isolate or experience loneliness that the rest of the population as recent study shows 43% of seniors regularly experience loneliness. As seniors get older, their risk of isolation increases. To prevent the negative effects of loneliness and isolation it is especially important to stay engaged throughout the day.

Seniors with limited social lives are more likely to suffer from Hypertension, Coronary Artery Disease, Cardiac issues, depression and anxiety.

Social Activities that improve mental health for seniors include Exercise classes, happy hours, group outings, regular phone calls or visits with family and friends, bingo, cards, and parlor games. We are so fortunate here at our village that we have so many of these activities and our beautiful new game room.
